

# **OPEN YOUTH EXHIBITS**

1. Open to all junior residents of Imperial County, between the ages of 5 and 19 (exhibitor age as of January 1<sup>st</sup> of the fair year.); individuals, members of organizations, classes, schools, etc. Primary: 5- to 8-year-olds; Junior: 9- to 12-year-olds or in the 4<sup>th</sup> grade; Intermediate: 13- to 14-year-olds, not in high school; Advanced: 14- to 19-year-olds.
2. All entries for the Junior Exhibits must be made on official entry forms furnished by the Fair. The exhibitor, parent or guardian, and leader, teacher, or advisor, if applicable must sign each form.
3. All State and Local rules are applicable to the Junior Exhibit Department.
4. All entries must be completed within one year of fair date, unless otherwise noted.
5. Two systems of judging will be used:

**American System** - In this system, each exhibit is judged not only on its own merit, but in comparison to other exhibits using score cards prepared by the State Division of Fairs and Expositions, and Fair Management.

**Danish System** - In this system, each exhibit is judged based upon established standards of quality per the Danish System Score Card. Each exhibit is judged according to how well it meets the standard, rather than how it compares with other exhibits. The following guidelines shall be used by Danish System Judges:

6. Extraordinary exhibit of remarkable talent and workmanship may be awarded a purple ribbon. This ribbon shall be paid the blue ribbon premium but will carry an additional point for the purposes of scoring high point and sweepstakes.

## PHOTOGRAPHY

1. Youth may enter up to 2 items per class, but may not exceed 26 total entries for the age division in which they are enrolled.
2. All photos must be mounted on studio mat board available for the fair office.
3. All exhibits are to be mounted across the narrow dimension (11”) of an 11”x12-1/2” white studio mount board. Photos must be mounted with the top edge of the print 1” below the top of the mount. The sides of the print must be an equal distance from the two sides of the mount.
4. A permanent mount must be made by using photographic adhesive mounting. Remove white border before mounting.
5. No lettering or dates will be permitted on the front of the mount or on the photograph. No underlays, borders or decorative mats are to be used.
6. On the back of the mount, write: Exhibitor’s name, club and age division. Please do in pencil and in the upper right hand corner of mat board.
7. Black and white or color photos may be exhibited in all division/classes.
8. Photos not meeting mounting guidelines will be for display only.

## FOOD PRESERVATION

1. No paraffin seals.
2. All canning exhibits must be in sealed standard canning jars. Standard jars are those containers specifically designed for canning purposes.
3. Non-acid foods: All vegetables, meats, poultry, and fish must be canned under pressure.
4. Low-acid foods: Fruits such as figs, should be made more acidic by adding lemon juice, as directed in the University of California, Agricultural Extension Service leaflet "Home Canning of Fruits".
5. Tomatoes and fruits (not including their juices) must be processed in a boiling water bath.
6. Jar sizes: **Fruits and Vegetables** - clear glass, wide or narrow mouth Mason jar; **Jellies** - clear glass, standard 7-12 once jelly jar; **Jams** - clear glass, pints or half pints, fruit jars only; **Syrups** - clear glass, half pint or larger.
7. All entries must have two jars of the specified size. One jar for sampling, one jar for display. Each properly labeled with product date and process.

Class 3b: DC Electric Projects – Electric projects with a battery or direct current power source. This class includes electric kits or original projects. This class also includes demonstration DC powered projects. Examples include: wiring two or three way switches, difference between series/parallel lighting circuits or wiring doorbell switches. All DC projects must work with batteries supplied by exhibitors. Projects must be constructed such that the judges have access to examine the quality of the wiring workmanship.

Class 3c: Electronic Projects – Electronic projects with a battery or direct current power source. This class includes electronic kits or original projects. Examples include: radios, telephones, toy robots, light meters, security systems, etc. May be constructed using printed circuit board, wire wrap, or beadboard technique. Include instruction/assembly manual from a kit. Include plans if an original project. Project must be constructed such that the judges have access to examine the quality of wiring and workmanship.
